## South American Gangs Target Professional Athletes' Homes in Robbery Spree

The Biden-Harris border crisis impacts all Americans, even those who may think they are protected because they are professional athletes.


As The Gateway Pundit <u>reported</u> — A recent ICE report has confirmed the devastating consequences of the Biden-Harris regime's disastrous open border policies and the gang members who can flow freely over the border.

According to a report from the Deputy Director of ICE Patrick Lechleitner sent to Congressman Tony Gonzalez, over 662,000 illegal immigrants with criminal histories are currently on ICE's national docket.

Even more alarming is that the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is currently tracking over 425,000 illegal immigrants convicted of various crimes, while 226,000 face pending criminal charges, all of whom have been released into the United States under the regime's lenient immigration enforcement.

Now, the NFL has warned its players to take precautions against a "transnational crime ring," which is believed to be tied to South America, that is suspected of numerous break-ins of athletes' homes.

NFL Media's <u>Tom Pelissero reported</u> that the league sent a memo to team security and players union officials warning them about the crime spree and suggesting measures to protect themselves and their families.

The NFL issued a security alert to team security directors and the players' union Wednesday about organized and skilled criminals that are increasingly targeting the homes of professional athletes, including the recent burglaries of Kansas City Chiefs stars <a href="Patrick Mahomes">Patrick Mahomes</a> and <a href="Travis Kelce">Travis Kelce</a>, according to the memo obtained by NFL.com.

Sources say the FBI is investigating the crime wave as international organized crime. The league, the NFL Players Association and team security forces also have been monitoring the crime spree, which is believed to be tied to a South American crime syndicate. At least one other current NFL player's home was burglarized in the past week.

"It's legit," said one source familiar with the situation. "It's a transnational crime ring, and over the last three weeks, they've focused on NBA and NFL players, and it's all over the country."
